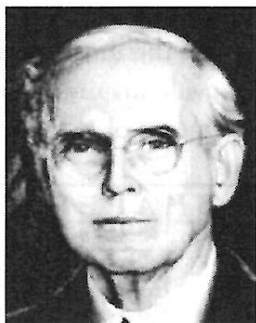

Robert E. Winsett wrote his first song at age seven. He was a prolific writer of gospel music. He wrote hundreds of songs and compiled scores of gospel song books. He was a contributing editor to several hymnals. The first book he compiled alone was in 1906, entitled UNION REVIVAL SONGS. Millions of song books and songs bearing the name of R.E. WINSETT have been published throughout the 20th Century. Many of these songs will live until our Lord returns.

R.E. Winsett had music publishing companies in Fort Smith, AR, Chattanooga, TN, and Dayton, TN. The headquarters were located in Dayton, TN until 1979. At that time the company was purchased by Ellis J. Crum, and moved to Kendallville, IN. The past several years the R.E. Winsett Music Company has been run by Sacred Music Trust.
